ADAMI Dialogue Baku seminar on video blogging and video creative content will be held in Azerbaijan

ADAMI Media Prize for Cultural Diversity in Eastern Europe is bringing its ADAMI Dialogue series to Azerbaijan with ADAMI Dialogue Baku, a workshop seminar on video blogging. The two-day workshop will be on October 27-28, 2017 at the Yarat Contemporary Art Center in Baku. The theme of the seminar: "Video blogging: Find your expression, record it and post it!"

The creative seminar aims to outline the structure of the vlogging phenomenon and help participants in the creation and implementation of their own video-blogging projects which in different ways positively promote cultural diversity and peaceful co-existence. The seminar will be led by international vloggers and experts from European broadcasters.

The curator of the seminar, Azerbaijani film director Elmar Imanov (Student Academy Award winner) will talk about the content of the forum. Producer and film director Stefan Tolz, the director of the ADAMI Media Prize, will come to Baku for the briefing, which will also be attended by a representative from the Embassy of the Federal Republic of German in Azerbaijan. There will be Skype call with the head of online strategy of French-German channel ARTE, Dominique Willieme, who will be giving a public lecture for media professionals in Baku on October 28 in the framework of the workshop.
